# **Electric Manager**

The Electric Manager must be able to understand standard electrical distribution, construction, and maintenance methods. These roles include but are not limited to, receiving projects from the General Manager and ensure they are completed in a timely manner, resolve conflicts within the department as well with the public, and work with and assist other department managers and the General Manager as needed. The manager will plan, organize, direct, and review the work of employees in the operation and maintenance of the Electric Department.

The position requires the individual to oversee trouble calls and emergency work to ensure a high safety standard as well as minimal outage time for the customers. Authorize and track expenditures within the Electric Department. Assist the General Manager in the preparation of an annual budget by providing input relative to the Electric Department's current and future needs. Works under the general supervision of the General Manager. Responsible for overseeing all things related to the daily operations of the Electric Department. Interaction with customers, sales representatives, contractors, plant managers, community leaders and other electric utility leaders projecting a positive image for the utility and the city.
